
This recording is dedicated to the memory of my dear friend, mentor and founder of The Swingle Singers, Ward Swingle, who loved the Tour de France.

Song Cycle: vive la vélorution! is the third in a highly popular series of large-scale choral works with jazz quintet by British composer Alexander L'Estrange, Uplifting, light-hearted and hugely entertaining, the ten songs reflect both the enormous appeal of cycling and the beauty of our natural surroundings.

Song Cycle was commissioned to mark the grand départ in Yorkshire of the 2014 Tour de France. The world première took place in York Minster on 28 June 2014 with over four hundred singers of all ages from across Yorkshire and The Call Me Al Quintet, led by Alexander L'Estrange.

L'Estranges in the Night is the multifaceted husband-and-wife musical duo otherwise known as Joanna Forbes L'Estrange and Alexander L'Estrange. Having met as undergraduates at Oxford University they formed a musical partnership which, now in its third decade, is stronger than ever. Together they write songs, record albums, run their own

record label andagio - the name is derived from their nicknames, "Arnd & Jo" - lead their popular jazz choral workshop You can sing...but can you swing?! and continually delight audiences with their unique combination of jazz standards, original songs, cabaret numbers, show tunes, English Song and, of course, Swinglestyle Bach.

Song Cycle: vive la vélorution!, featured in the Spring 2015 issue of Ensemble Magaxine, is Joanna and Alexander's first large-scale collaboration as

composer and lyricist. Joanna wrote the lyrics for four of the ten songs and co-wrote the music for two of them.

My wheel and I appears twice in the track listing, first in its Song Cycle version, that is to say for SATB choir and jazz quintet, and secondly in its L'Estranges in the Night version with Joanna multilayering the vocals and multi-instrumentalist Alexander on guitar, double bass, piano accordion and additional vocals.

Alexander L'Estrange is one of Britain's most popular living choral composers. His flagship work, *Zimbe! Come sing the songs of Africa!*, an ingenious fusion of African song and jazz, has received many hundreds of performances worldwide and spawned a hugely successful series of large-scale choral works in a similar vein. A passionate advocate for the importance of singing in schools and the wider community, L'Estrange presents workshops on his music with a mixture of energy, fun and consummate musicianship that has become synonymous with his name.



L'Estrange's compositions are testament to his eclectic musical training and career. A classically trained cellist, pianist and singer, he is a professional jazz double bassist and pianist and has musically directed shows in the West End and on Broadway. In addition to the large-scale community choral works for which he is perhaps best known, he has written an award-winning musical entitled *Hello Life!*, many sacred choral anthems (recorded by Tenebrae for SIGNUM), several jazz songs (recorded by L'Estranges in the Night for *andagio*) and Love's Philosophy, settings of three poems by Shelley, Tennyson and Byron, which is currently on the ABRSM Singing Syllabus. He also wrote all of the arrangements for and produced the album *Great American Songbook* by The King's Singers.
